#### **Christmas Eve dinner**

Christmas Eve diner is an integral part of Christmas Eve. All family members are together and eat traditional Christmas Eve meals. The table has to be pepared first.



## We begin Christmas Eve dinner with a prayer.

After the prayer, the father of family puts a cross with honey on the foreheads of the family members.



Before we start eating, we cut one apple in half. If it's nice inside, next year will be good.



The first meal are waffers with honey. We also add a clove of garlic to them.





Next meal is traditional cabbage soup. It is eaten with potato pancakes, which we call bandurniky.





After cabbage soup we eat opekance. Opekance are small pieces of bread. They can have different flavors. We usually make cottage cheese, cabbage and poppy opekance.



The last meal is fish. We always have carp. We make carp on two styles: pure (with onion on butter) and horseshoe (coated)





#### **Christmas carols**

Carols are songs with a Christmas theme. They are sung at any time during Christmas, but especially on Christmas Eve.

**Typical Christmas carols are:** 


Silent Night
