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Červený Kláštor

Červený Kláštor is a village located on the banks of the Dunajec River near the Slovak-Polish border. It is mainly connected with the national cultural monument with the same name - Červený kláštor (The Red Monastery). It is one of the most important monuments in Slovakia. The monastery was founded in 1320. In Slovakia, it represents one of the few preserved examples of monastic architecture of the Carthusian and Camaldolese orders. You can also sail on rafts on Dunajec in Červený Kláštor.

Stará Ľubovňa

Stará Ľubovňa is a city located in the northeastern part of Slovakia. The dominant feature of the city is definitely Ľubovňa castle, built at the beginning of the 14th century. There is a museum of folk architecture under the castle – skanzen Ľubovňa (Ľubovňa open-air museum). It is one of the youngest in Slovakia and consists of 25 buildings. The dominant feature of the exhibition is a log Greek Catholic church of the Eastern Rite. In addition to it, there are also log residential houses, a log blacksmith's forge and a mill.

Košice

Košice, the second largest city in Slovakia, is located in the eastern part of the country. Its most significant landmark is the largest sacred building in Slovakia by area - the gothic St. Elizabeth's Cathedral. It is located on Hlavná ulica (Main street). It is the promenade of the city lined with palatial and bourgeois houses with restaurants, boutiques and cafés. The city also hosts the oldest European marathon - the International Peace Marathon.

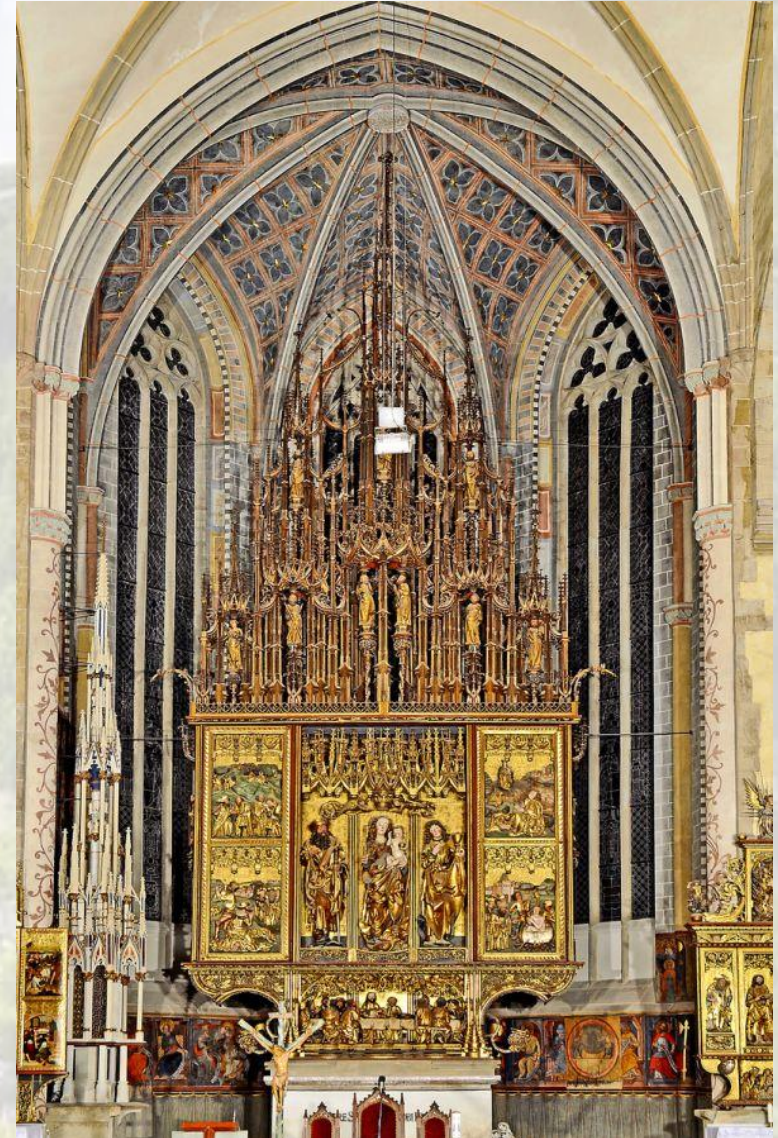

Levoča

Levoča is a cultural and historical treasure among Slovak cities. It is one of the most visited places in Slovakia and is included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. An important part of Levoča is the vast rectangular square where stands the Roman Catholic parish Church of St. Jacob, one most important sacral buildings in Slovakia. There is the late-Gothic wooden main altar of St. Jacob inside the church, which, with a height of 18.6 m, is the tallest of its kind in the world.

Spiš Castle

Spiš Castle is one of the largest castle complexes in Central Europe. Its area is more than 4 hectares large and it rises above town of Spišské Podhradie. It is also included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. The most valuable and oldest part of the castle is the Upper Castle.

Belianska cave

Belianska cave is the largest and only accessible high-altitude drop cave in the Tatra National Park. Of the total known length of 3.5 km, 1,135 m is accessible to the public. In recent years, the cave has been used for convalescent paleoclimatic stays.

Poprad

Poprad lies at the foot of the High Tatras, so it rightly deserves the comparison "Entrance gate to the High Tatras." It is surrounded by the High Tatras massif from the north. Visitors can see the centre of Poprad with a museum and gallery, the Spišská Sobota city monument reserve or visit the thermal water park.

The Tatras

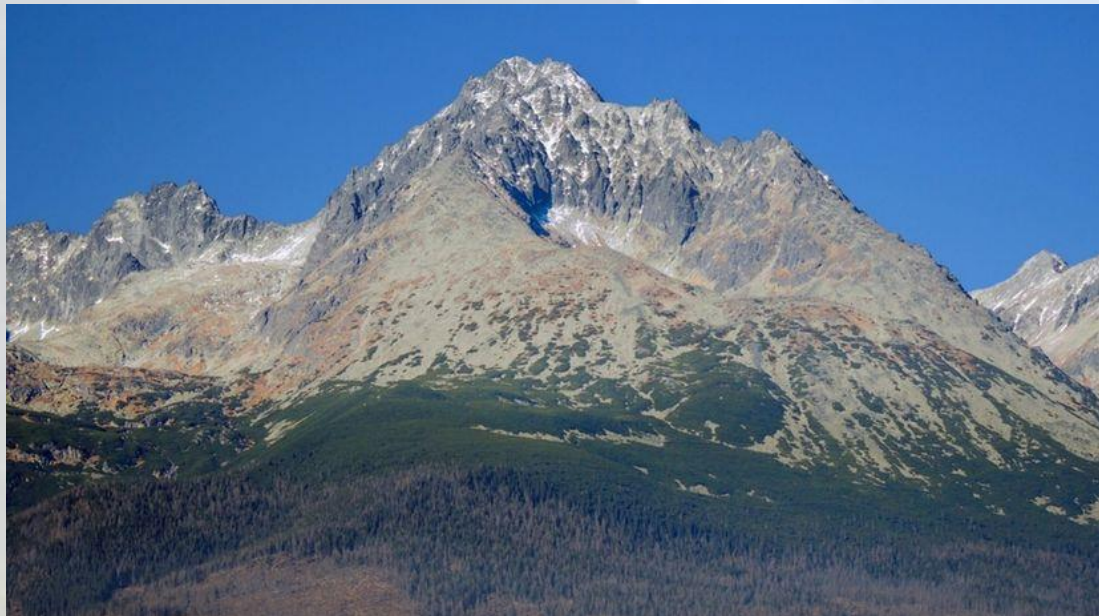
The Tatras are the highest mountain range in Slovakia. They are located in the northern part of the country. They form a natural border between Slovakia and Poland. There are many hotels and lodges to visit. It is a popular place for skiing and hiking thanks to its nature. Animals such as chamois or marmot can be seen there. The highest peak of the Tatras and Slovakia is Gerlach peak with a height of 2655 m above sea level.

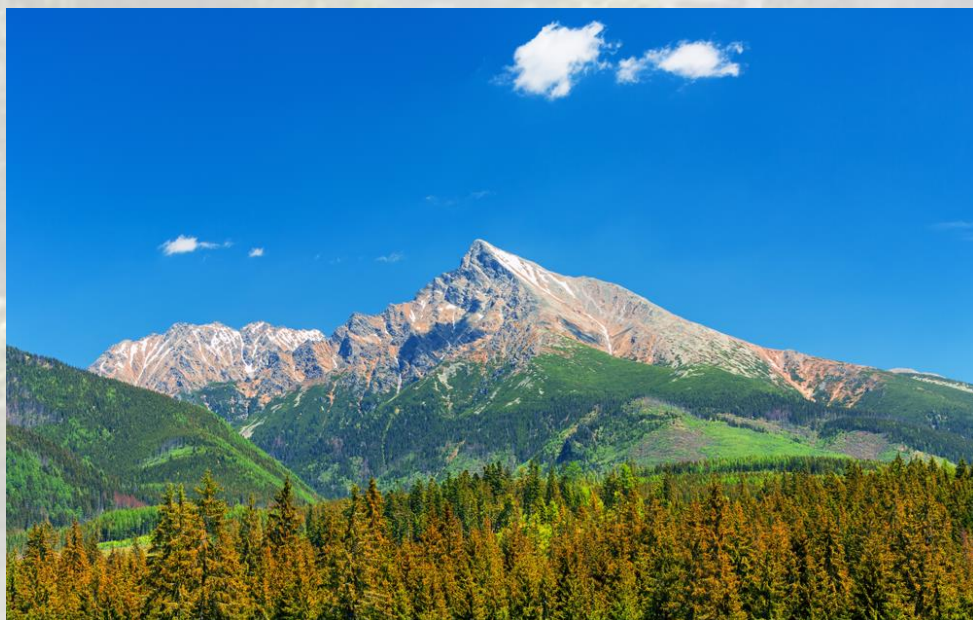
